

Annual CWL Membership Fee = \$37.00



When will the world end and Jesus Return?

---A very relevant topic for this part of the liturgical season, as we reflect this weekend on Christ, the King of the Universe! The theme is quite popular in secular movies about the end times, too. To answer the question, we can rely on three sources: scripture, theology, and the limitations of human knowledge.

In the Gospels, Jesus speaks directly about the end times and his second coming. Most notably, in Matthew 24:36, Jesus says, "But about that day and hour no one knows, neither the angels of heaven, nor the Son, but only the Father." In other words, the precise timing for the end of the world is not even known by Jesus himself! It's known by the Father in Heaven. This also means it's beyond the scope of human knowledge to ascertain. So there's no need to speculate or to give our attention to someone else who thinks they've discovered some hidden or secret knowledge in the Bible or who claims to have received some direct revelation from God concerning the end times. They are all charlatans.

The Book of Revelation, along with other apocalyptic literature in the Bible, such as the Book of Daniel, also contain vivid imagery about the final judgement, the defeat of evil, and the establishment of God's kingdom. However, the Church teaches that these passages are typically symbolic in nature and should therefore, not be interpreted as literal roadmaps or timetables. Instead, they should serve as a reminder, to all of us, of the ultimate victory of God and the need for constant vigilance and hope.

What can theology contribute to the answer to this question? The church's eschatology—the theological study of the end times affirms that "Christ will indeed return in glory to judge the living and the dead." (CCC 668-682). However, it also reminds us that before this happens, "the Church will pass through a final trial" and that "God alone knows the day and hour." (CCC 675-677).

Certain signs will precede the end times: the preaching of the Gospel to all nations, a final unleashing of evil, and the conversion of Israel. Yet, these signs are not presented as precise predictors, but as general signposts, urging Christians to live in readiness and expectation of the end at all times. Faithfulness in word and deed to God, day in and day out, is therefore essential.

The Church's theological stance then is fundamentally one of hope, not fear. The final coming of Jesus ----Thy Kingdom Come---- is seen as the fulfillment of God's promise—a time when justice, peace, and love will be definitively established and all of God's faithful children will be saved. That's what the ancient prayer, "Maranatha! Come, Lord Jesus!" means. (Revelation 22:20). Keep this in mind as we prepare to enter Advent Season next weekend.
