The meaning behind Matthew 1:25

The Catholic Church holds the doctrine that Mary, the mother of Jesus, is the Ever Virgin, meaning that Mary remained a virgin before, during, and after the birth of Jesus Christ. Some people question this doctrine because of what is written in Matthew 1:25: "But he [Joseph] did not know her until she gave birth to a son. And he gave him the name Jesus." The key word in that passage is "until." To some, it suggests that normal marital relations occurred after Jesus' birth, indicating that Mary did not remain a virgin. This interpretation, however, is not accepted by the Catholic Church.

Why not? ---Because the word "until" (heos hou in Greek), when used in the Bible, doesn't always imply a change of state after a specified time. Instead, it simply affirms what was true up to that point, without making any claim about what may have or could have happened afterward.

Similar language is used elsewhere in the Bible (e.g., 2 Samuel 6:23: "And Michal, the daughter of Saul, had no children until the day of her death."), where it is clear that the condition did not change after the stated period.

Thus, the Church maintains that Matthew 1:25 affirms that Joseph and Mary did not have marital relations before Jesus' birth, and the word 'until' does not imply that they did so afterward. This interpretation supports the belief in Mary's perpetual virginity.

Furthermore, the title "Ever Virgin" is a longstanding tradition in Catholic theology and is affirmed in the Catechism of the Catholic Church (CCC 499–501). Additionally, the Church teaches that Mary's virginity was not only physical, but also a sign of her complete dedication to God's will. The Second Vatican Council affirmed the perpetual virginity of Mary by stating that she remained a virgin in conceiving Christ, in giving birth to Him, and throughout her life (Lumen Gentium 52–69).

In summary, the Catholic Church interprets Matthew 1:25 as consistent with the doctrine of Mary's perpetual virginity. The use of "until" in this and other biblical passages does not necessarily indicate a change after the specified time. The Church continues to teach that Mary remained a virgin before, during, and after the birth of Jesus, and venerates her as the "Ever Virgin Mother of God."
